### Department Administration Support

The Department of Early Education & Social Studies office is located at room 2469, on the first floor. To access the office from the main reception desk; proceed up the main staircase and turn right, follow the corridor passing the stairs and take the next right, room 2469 is on the right-hand side.

### **BSc Hons Health & Social Care AU391 Level 8 QQI Framework**

The Department Early Education and Social Studies is a vibrant, dynamic department with approx. 600 students at ATU Donegal. It is equipped with up-to-date equipment and state-of-the-art laboratories.

The BSc (Hons) in Health and Social Care programme is approved by CORU. Social Care is defined by CORU as a profession focused on providing care, protection, support, and advocacy in a relationship-based manner, especially for those marginalised or with additional needs.

- Applicants are required to undergo Garda Vetting. For any programme where Garda Vetting is required, non-EU applicants will not be considered unless/until the pool of qualified EU applicants has been exhausted. For those admitted to any course requiring Garda Vetting, registration is temporary until such time as the vetting process is successfully completed.
- Applicants wishing to join this programme must complete a Health Declaration. Applicants must be deemed fit to practice in order to continue on the programme.
- BSc (Hons) in Health and Social Care students must meet the “Fitness to Practice” standards outlined in the ATU policy. They must acknowledge this requirement on the Health and Social Care declaration form after reading and understanding the policy.
- A fundamental aspect of this program is the integration of professional placement learning, providing students with invaluable practice experience.
- Students are required to complete a total of 840 hours of practice placement. Placement allocations may be anywhere within the Republic of Ireland. Travel and accommodation are the responsibility of the learner.
- Applications for advanced entry, exemptions or recognition of prior learning are not considered for this programme.
- Students will be required to undertake mandatory training as outlined by course schedules. This is required prior to students going on placement.
- Students are required to have a minimum attendance record of 85% per module in each semester. Failure to meet this requirement may result in additional assessments and/or having to repeat the module.

As part of our programme of study you will take both theory and practical classes. Practical classes are an essential part of your programme as they put into practice much of the theory you have been taught in class. Employers expect and require graduates to have up-to-date practical skills. The Department places great emphasis on this aspect of our programmes and students are required to attend and participate in all scheduled classes/ practical classes and labs. This is a full-time programme with classes taking place Monday-Friday from 09.30 - 17.30.

In addition to scheduled classes students are also required to undertake independent learning. Students on the Health & Social Care programme may be asked to wear an ATU branded polo-shirt/hoodie for some engagements. These are provided by the Department and the costs are covered by the additional course costs. (Please refer to the Quick Guide Information for further details.)


**Health and Social Care students are required to be Garda Vetted and must complete mandatory training.** People Moving and Handling training is provided by the Department and is scheduled for all Year 1 students in Semester 2, following completion of the summer examination process. Garda Vetting is mandatory, and you are required to provide all necessary documents, including proof of ID and proof of address to the Garda Vetting Liaison Officer. Further information regarding Garda Vetting will be provided to you in due course.

Professional practice placement is an integral part of your programme of study. 100% attendance is required on professional practice placement which takes place in Year 2 and Year 3 of your programme. Our programme team will support your preparation for placement. Students are not permitted to arrange their own placement and all allocations are arranged through the Practice Placement Co-ordinator in consultation with the relevant Department of Early Education and Social Studies practice placement governance teams. Further information regarding professional practice placement will be provided in due course.

Once again congratulations on securing your place in the Department of Early Education and Social Studies. Induction for **Health and Social Care Students** takes place on **Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> September** and class starts on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> September.
