The Department of Early Education & Social Studies office is located at room 2469, on the first floor. To access the office from the main reception desk; proceed up the main staircase and turn right, follow the corridor passing the stairs and take the next right, room 2469 is on the right-hand side. Support services available to students include:

- Communicating to students regularly via ATU Student email regarding timetables, class groups, class activities, attendance requirements etc.
- Scheduling appointments for students to meet with the Head of Department if required.
- Provision of guidance with regards to timetables/student groups etc.
- Providing the College stamp/logo on required documents such as medical card applications, social welfare applications etc.

You must present your ATU student ID card if you require any of our services. Please note that there is a 5-day timeframe for documents to be issued and this may increase at peak times. You are advised to request any necessary documentation in a timely manner to allow us to support your request. Administrative support can only be provided directly to registered students and cannot be provided to third parties (parents/guardians). The Department Early Education and Social Studies is a vibrant, exciting department with approx. 600 students at ATU Donegal Campus. It is equipped with up-to-date equipment and state-of-the-art laboratories.

As part of your programme of study you will take both theory and practical classes. Practical classes are an essential part of your programme as they put into practice much of the theory you have been taught in class. Employers expect and require graduates to have up-to-date practical skills. The Department places great emphasis on this aspect of our programmes and students are required to attend and participate in all scheduled lectures/practical classes and labs. This is a full-time programme with classes taking place Monday-Friday from 09.30 - 17.30. In addition to scheduled classes, students are also required to undertake independent learning. Students on the Inclusive Practice for Special Needs Assistance programme may be asked to wear an ATU branded polo-shirt/hoodie for some engagements. These are provided by the Department and the costs are covered by the additional course costs.

Inclusive Practice for Special Needs Assistance students are required to be Garda Vetted and must complete mandatory training. This training is provided by the Department and is scheduled for all Year 1 students in Semester 2. Garda Vetting is mandatory, and you are required to provide all necessary documents, including proof of ID and proof of address to the Garda Vetting Liaison Officer. Further information regarding Garda Vetting will be provided to you in due course.

Professional practice placement is an integral part of your programme of study. 100% attendance is required on professional practice placement. Our programme teams will work with you to ensure you are prepared for placement. Students are not permitted to arrange their own placement. All allocations are arranged by the Practice Placement Co-ordinator in consultation with the relevant practice placement governance teams. Further information regarding professional practice placement will be provided in due course.

Once again congratulations on securing your place in the Department of Early Education and Social Studies. Induction for Inclusive Practice for Special Needs Assistance Students takes place on Wednesday 11th September and class starts on Monday 15th September.
