# **Summary of Proposed Modifications**

Introduce INFO06062 Business Information Tools Module as mandatory module in Stage 2.

Convert HOSP06178 Food For Health and Wellbeing from mandatory to elective (Stage 2).

Convert HOSP06192 Workplace Culture from mandatory to elective (Stage 2).

Remove TOUR07031 Public Relations Module as an elective from stage 4 APS.

### **Rationale for Modifications**

Changes in stage 2 are as a result of errors and omissions when the common entry route was introduced.

TOUR07031 Public Relations is a level 7 module and should not have been included in the final year of the level 8 programme as it does not meet ATU's programme design policy in relation to the requirements for a level 8 degree.

## **Reason for Overall Finding**

The changes proposed by the Programme Board were interrogated by the panel and are deemed appropriate, and do not impact on students' ability to achieve the programme's learning outcomes.

#### **Conditions**

- 1. Ensure the duration of the Business Information Tools module is correctly specified on the module descriptor.
- 2. Review the module learning outcomes for Business Information Tools to ensure that they are outcomes rather than process focussed, that they commence with active verbs and that outcomes are expressed as single sentences.

#### Recommendations

- 1. Ensure that the Business Information Tools content is topical and explicitly includes artificial intelligence and data protection. Amend MLO 4 to include emerging trends as a topic and ensure it is reflected in the indicative syllabus.
- 2. Review MLO 6 to ensure that it does not seek to achieve more than is feasible, and be more related to the needs of the graduate working in industry. This may include using emerging technologies to navigate and build in a web environment.
- 3. When reviewing the Business Information Tools module take the opportunity to update reading lists and other resources.
