



N-TUTORR launches Student Digital Backpack (SDB)

Ireland's technological sector, combining five new technological universities and two institutes of technology, have formed a partnership to develop and deliver on the National Technological University Transformation for Recovery and Resilience (N-TUTORR) programme in 2023 and 2024. This national programme, which is EU funded (38 million euro) and overseen by the Higher Education Authority (HEA) Ireland, utilises the national scale and scope of the technological university sector to deliver a best-practice suite of initiatives and opportunities for the learner, for staff development and supported by necessary enabling technologies.







Under N-TUTORR's Stream 1 Work Package Academy for education for sustainability, leadership and employability, ATU have led out on the development of the Student Digital Backpack (SDB) for the TU sector. The Student Digital Backpack has been developed to provide students across the Technological University (TU) sector with additional skills to complement their existing programmes of study, embedding the N-TUTORR transforming learning themes (e.g., Digital Transformation, Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, Academic Integrity, Education for Sustainability, Universal Design for Learning, Employability). The SDB is an online platform in the form of a Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) for students across the TU sector to sign up to complete a variety of short, non-accredited courses.

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- The platform is a user-friendly, self-directed learning interface.
- It includes a badge award on completion of each short course.
- Courses can be embedded into core modules, complement module content, used to prompt class discussion (e.g., a flipped learning approach), incorporated into assessment, or used as a stand-alone activity.
- Extensive evaluation has taken place to date with 100 champions across the TU sector evaluating 5 short courses and gaining digital badges on the proof-of-concept SDB interface.
- Overall feedback has been positive, and great ideas shared to enhance the user experience of SDB.
- Further short courses will be added by N-TUTORR partners to the platform in 2024.
